Beach Clean Up Day - July 1

We are looking for community volunteers to help clean up the Glebe Harbor and Cabin Point Beaches on July 1 starting at 8:30 am., (meet at the clubhouse at 8:30 am). Volunteers are need for a variety of tasks to include picking up trash, cutting fallen tree limbs, cutting large pieces of lumber into smaller pieces for removal, and weed trimming to cut down identified invasive weeds.

Reminder - Climbing on the rock breakwaters is prohibited on the Cabin Point and Glebe Harbor Beaches. As much as these rock structures may appear to be a great place to take a photo or to fish, it is unsafe to walk, stand or climb on the rocks.



Additionally, these structures are living shorelines. They have been seeded with oyster shells to promote the growth of oysters along the rock surfaces. Over time, the growth of the oysters will help to stabilize the rock breakwaters.

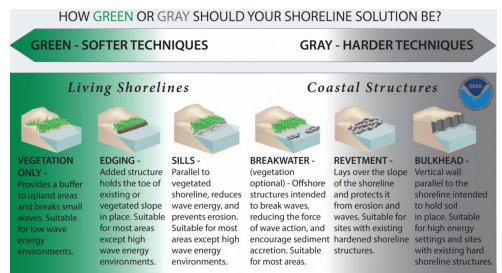

Do you have questions about your shoreline? The Northern Neck Master Gardeners' (NNMG) Shoreline Evaluation Program will offer a **free** program on "Shoreline Basics: 10 Essentials Every Waterfront Homeowner Needs to Know" on June 9 at the Helen and Tayloe Murphy Hall, Westmoreland State Park, Montross. The program will help participants understand the basic issues associated with storm water runoff and the erosive power of tides, winds and currents.

In addition, The Virginia Conservation Assistance Program (VCAP) will be explained. VCAP offers financial support to waterfront homeowners, which can provide an **80% cost-sharing (up to \$30,000).**
